



Keyboarding Skills for children with SLD

Learning to touch type, i.e. type using proper finger-key combinations without looking at the keyboard, helps children with SLD recognize letters and improve hand-eye coordination. It is an empowering skill with lifelong benefits.

Features:

- 1) Multisensory, interactive and entertaining
- 2) Correct posture and good keyboarding habits
- 3) Use of proper finger-key combinations without looking at the keyboard
- 4) Systematic practice in typing selected letters and words introduced in progression.
- 5) Practice in coordinating audio input, visual guidance and physical performance under the careful guidance and encouragement of teachers.
- 6) Learners progress at their own pace and are awarded a certificate upon satisfactory completion of each level.

Class Size: Small group of 3 students with SLD
